Jigme Thutob Namgyal was appointed as the Dorje Lopon [Vajracharya] at Yanglesho Monastery in 1992 after having served for 6 years as personal secretary to Chatral Rinpoche and demonstrated mastery in the performance of all ritual practices according to the Longchen Nyingtig tradition. He has been responsible since 1992 with conducting all religious functions at the monastery, educating the monks, tutoring Kathok Situ Rinpoche and Yangsi Dudjom Rinpoche. Yanglesho is the historical site of Guru Padmasambhava's attainment of his Mahamudra siddha [making it the Bodhgaya of the Vajrayana] and one of the most respected Nyingma monasteries in the world today.
